Thomas Mikal “Mickey” Snortland was a father of four North students between 2000 and 2016. He was well known for his enthusiastic support of North High School students and their endeavors. He could be found supporting many school events, including music concerts and contests, theatre performances and sporting events. After these events he liked to give a “high five” to all participants. Mickey was a North Dakota farmer and a long-time member of the Bell Bank Board of Directors. During high school Mickey was involved in Choir, Band (alto saxophone) and technical theatre. He excelled in baseball, basketball and cross-country. This scholarship was established in his memory to recognize North students who have pursued the fine arts with dedication during their high school years.

3. Discuss your college plans including where you plan to attend and have been accepted, your chosen area of study, and your long-term goals. This scholarship is not dependent on whether you pursue a major in the fine arts or opt for another area of study.
4. How would receiving this scholarship make a difference in your future plans?
5. Please attach a copy of your transcript to show your school involvement in the arts. This scholarship is NOT based on your GPA, although a GPA of 2.5 or higher is recommended. It is based on your commitment to the fine arts, by depth and/or variety, during high school.
