Anjali K. Lall was born on September 21, 1995, and passed away on June 7, 2014, shortly after completing her freshman year at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. She was an honors student in the College of Biological Sciences and had plans to attend medical school. Anjali was recognized for her academic achievements, making the Dean's List for both semesters of her first year. While attending the University of Minnesota, Anjali volunteered at the Jeremiah Project and served as a lab assistant at the Division of Endocrinology and Diabetes, Department of Medicine. She was also selected to be a General Board Member of the CBS Student Board for the 2014-2015 school year.

Anjali graduated from Davies High School in Fargo, ND, in 2013. She was a talented student and excelled in many areas, including debate, speech, student congress, orchestra, and Fill the Dome. Anjali was also recognized for her academic achievements and received the North Dakota US Presidential Scholar Award, a National Merit Scholarship, and a YWCA Woman of the Year Award. During the summer of 2013, she was a Barry Foundation intern at The Arts Partnership, where she started Chalk Fest. Anjali represented North Dakota at the 75th Annual National Finals for the American Legion High School Scholarship Program in 2012 and won the National Peace Essay Contest organized by the United States Institute of Peace in 2010.

Anjali's passing was a great loss to those who knew her. Her teachers, mentors, and friends remember her for her beautiful smile, gracious attitude, self-discipline, leadership, and kind and giving spirit.
