

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE SINCE GRADUATING?

I got obsessed with rock climbing! I went to NDSU where I got my degree in sport management with a minor in business administration. Originally I wanted to work at a university doing outdoor recreation, but realized the only part of hiking and camping I liked was to go climb. That's when I really started getting into the business minor and joined a couple friends on the first quest for a local climbing gym, that was spring of 2015. I spent the next several years just working a lot. I actually drove Zamboni and was in facilities management for a couple years at Scheels Arena. Tried to make the climbing gym happen a couple more times, but to no success. Then I had the opportunity to go back to NDSU and get my MBA and that is when I made a real push to open the climbing facility. I developed the business plan, started seeking out funding, and developed a Kickstarter campaign.

This was postponed when I went to work for Nature of the North in Moorhead which further solidified my love for business and start ups. Worked there for about 2 years, and then in Fall of 2021 we found the right bank and we were able to start up Fargo Climbing. In addition to that I spent a lot of time traveling across the US to rock climb, from Tennessee and Arkansas to Utah and Vegas. Climbed Devils Tower multiple times as well!

HOW DO YOU FEEL YOUR EDUCATION AT FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS HELPED PREPARE YOU FOR YOUR CURRENT CAREER?

I feel like it has taught me to be adaptable. It is not about being the smartest or the best at XYZ but how you adapt, problem solve, and critically think about things!

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FAMILY.

My dad teaches at NDSU, Human Development and Family Science. My mom teaches kindergarten at Lincoln Elementary. I have two sisters who also graduated from North High. My older sister lives in Eagan Minnesota with her husband and son and has a master's degree in GIS. She works very passionately in that field. My younger sister has a Master's of Public Health and Latin American Studies and works passionately in that field.

WHAT IS YOUR BEST MEMORY FROM YOUR TIME AT NORTH HIGH SCHOOL?

Breadstick day, I would eat only bread sticks. I want to say it was Wednesdays, I would buy probably 8 or 10 bread sticks. Latin Club and class, band, and jazz band. All the great friends I met. This year will be our 10 year reunion and I am looking forward to seeing what everyone has been up to. I feel like we were a smaller class so we got along well and were closer than other classes! Also no taxes, life was much simpler.

WHO INSPIRED YOU THE MOST IN HIGH SCHOOL AND WHY?

Mr. Brekke and Mr. Tessman, my band and jazz band teachers. They showed me that through hard work and perseverance, things that feel uncomfortable or impossible are achievable. **Mr. Vince Williams** for showing us it's not about your past, but where you are going that is important and that to be early is to be on time, to be on time is to be late, and to be late is to be forgotten. **Mr. David Volk**, because the value is in the details, the littlest details often have the biggest effects. Also, I was not the best at Latin, mediocre at best, but that class taught me you don't have to be perfect to love what you are doing. **Mr. Midgarden** for showing me that to do what you love you really never work a day in your life.



WHAT HAVE YOU DONE SINCE GRADUATING?

Alongside Chris Deal, I co-founded Fargo Climbing, a rock climbing gym and Fargo's first climbing gym.

HOW DO YOU FEEL YOUR EDUCATION AT FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS HELPED PREPARE YOU FOR YOUR CURRENT CAREER?

It gave me the foundation to grow myself into the person I am today, and I am proud of that.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FAMILY.

I have one younger sister who is my best friend. My parents and my sister have always been very supportive of my choices even if they might not agree with them. They let me learn on my own

while providing support and guidance when necessary. I am very thankful for that.

WHAT IS YOUR BEST MEMORY FROM YOUR TIME AT WOODROW WILSON HIGH SCHOOL?

I loved seeing my friends everyday. I always looked forward to the time spent with them. I am lucky enough to still have the same friends that I've known from my time in school.

WHO INSPIRED YOU THE MOST IN HIGH SCHOOL AND WHY?

Dick Fisher, the head coach of the Fargo North High School swim team, has definitely impacted me the most. On the swim team we swam with kids from grades 7-12, and as I joined my Junior year, Coach Fisher always drilled us to set a good example for our younger teammates. Admittedly, I wasn't as good of an example as I could have been. Now, as I have grown as a person I realize it's important to lead my life as a good example for the people around me. Those lessons are something I think about often and they are extremely important to me.

IS THERE ANY OTHER INFORMATION YOU WOULD LIKE TO SHARE WITH US?

It's cliché, but do what you love. Don't waste your time doing something you don't like, and don't wait for that thing to make you happy. Find what makes you happy and do it well.

SPECIAL THANK YOU TO ERIC JOHNSON, FARGO CENTRAL 1963!

Eric Johnson donated a restored silver-plated flute to Fargo Davies band for a student in need that may not have the means to rent or buy an instrument. Eric submitted the below history of the flute:

This silver-plated flute was manufactured by the A. Reynolds Company in Cleveland, Ohio, serial number 12467. It was likely manufactured in the late 1940s or early 1950s. My parents acquired it for me, probably in 1954. It began its musical life in Fargo.

I attended Clara Barton Elementary School and I began taking flute lessons when I was in the third grade. I took lessons at the Daveau Music Company in Fargo, which was located at 615 First Avenue North. They had lesson rooms on the second floor. My teacher was a music professor from Concordia College.

My classmates and I at Clara Barton were exceedingly fortunate to have had an inspiring music teacher, Miss Wilds. Below is a photograph of our orchestra, probably taken in 1956. I am the flute player in the front row at the end.



I credit Miss Wilds with instilling in me a life-long interest in music, even if I did not play the flute beyond my years at Agassiz Junior High School, where I also played in the orchestra. I probably last performed as a student at Agassiz in 1959 or 1960. I especially remember playing a borrowed piccolo in a performance of the Stars and Stripes Forever.



Steven played tuba in the Fargo North High School Concert and Marching Bands, and string bass in Jazz Band. He served as cadet commander of AFJROTC squadron and was a National Honor Society inductee. Steven graduated with honors with what counselor Miss Dehne said, "was the most academic credits in the history of the school."






GAIL LEWIS ~ FARGO NORTH, 1972


