Lenore and Norman Tenneson deeply valued education and community service. Lenore taught in a one room schoolhouse in western North Dakota and at Agassiz Junior High School in Fargo. She was a dedicated volunteer in her church, the YWCA, the AAUW and the local Democratic Party. Among her many awards, in 1964, President Lyndon Johnson appointed her to the National Citizen's Committee on Community Relations. Norman practiced law for over 50 years and was a senior partner at Tenneson, Serkland & Lundberg et al. Among many leadership positions, he served as the President of the North Dakota Bar Association, St. Luke's Hospital, and First Methodist Church.

Lenore and Norman deeply valued education and community service. They believed in the importance of education as a key to living a full and emotionally satisfying life. They were dedicated to public service and felt a responsibility to contribute time, energy, intelligence and enthusiasm to worthy institutions within their community.

The Lenore and Norman Tenneson Scholarship will be awarded annually to a graduating senior from Fargo South High School. The scholarship will be presented to a student who has demonstrated a strong desire to learn and understands the value of education, as did Lenore and Norman.
