The Juelke-Disale Educator Scholarship is awarded annually to a Fargo area student whose native language is not English and who is going to pursue a post-secondary degree in Education.

Leah Juelke is a Fargo South alumna, Fargo South teacher, and the 2018 North Dakota Teacher of the Year. She has a passion for education and helping diverse students share their voices and advocate for themselves. In 2020, Juelke was named one of the top 10 teachers in the world by the Varkey Foundation. Ranjit Disale, a teacher in India and the grand prize winner of the 2020 Global Teacher Prize Award, shared his prize winnings with the top 10 teachers. Disale also created a non-profit for girls' education, which he and Juelke head together. Both teachers are passionate about mentoring and investing in future educators from diverse backgrounds.

The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior using the below criteria:

- Be a native speaker of a language OTHER than English
- GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Senior enrolling in two or four-year post-secondary institution majoring in Education (Teacher, Coaching, Counseling, Administration)
- Special consideration will be given to students who were or are currently enrolled as English Learner (EL) students.
- Demonstrate a financial need
